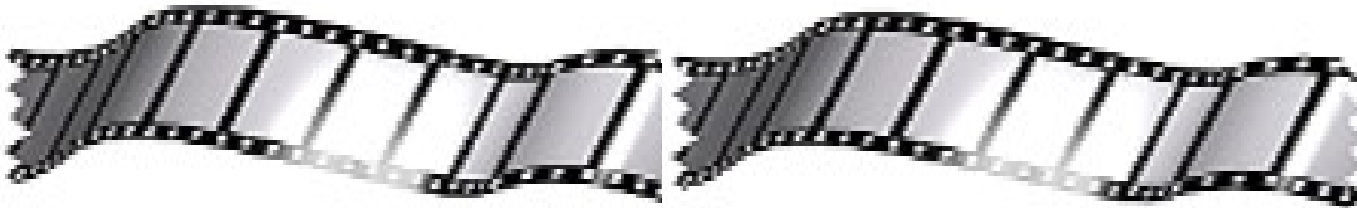

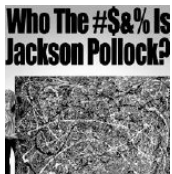
Friday, January 29 - 7 pm - American Teen



Sundance winner: 2008 Documentary Directing Award

Billed as the documentary version of The Breakfast Club, this film follows four high school students in Warsaw, Indiana from September of their Senior year right up until graduation. This film is a fascinating snapshot of the frustrations of small town kids on the cusp of adulthood dealing with heartache, social hierarchy, the anxiety of scholarships and the other pressures on the American teen.

Friday, February 26 - 7 pm - Who the #%\$@& is Jackson Pollock?



Teri Horton, a 73 year-old long-haul truck driver, picked up a painting in a thrift shop. When she went to sell it in a garage sale a local art teacher recognized the painting as a possible work by famed American artist Jackson Pollock. What followed pitted a blue collar worker against the highest and mightiest people in the art world and would perhaps change forever the way art is authenticated.

Friday, March 26 - 7 pm - Pop & Me



Richard Roe and his son Chris embark on a 26-country journey around the world. While dealing with the strain this 6-month trek brought to their own relationship, the pair listens with tears in their eyes while a father and son in war-torn Kashmir talk about their love for each other, and interviews fifth and sixth generation father and son gondoliers in Venice's watery passages. In Monaco, Julian Lennon confides what it was like to be the son of a Beatle. The Roe's on-the-road footage is interspersed with their home movies from the '70s, making this a heartfelt exploration of the bonds fathers and sons share.

Friday, April 29 - 7 pm - Whaledreamers



This visually stunning film offers an incredible glimpse into the rarely seen and scarcely understood tribal culture of whales. This film explores the connection between the elegance of these "mothers of the sea" and ancient civilizations around the world whose culture and very existence is based on whales.
